

### Meet our new maestro!

We are delighted to welcome Rob Blythe as our new Director of Music and Organist at Christ Church. He covered several services for us during the vacancy, including Christmas, so we got to know him then. His first official Sunday was Mothering Sunday in March. But let him introduce himself:

'I'm delighted to be the new Director of Music and Organist at Christ Church and have very much enjoyed getting to know you while 'covering' services and Christmas at Shamley Green.



I was born and raised in Alnmouth, Northumberland, falling in love with the organ and church music from a very young age. Attending a very 'musical' primary school, I was inspired by a former concert-pianist that used to accompany the school carol services, taking piano lessons from six years old and gaining my Grade 8 through tuition from Mr Aubrey Richardson. I have always enjoyed accompanying solo singers and choirs and was accompanist and organist for my High School Choir for seven years.

As much as I enjoy playing the piano, it is the organ that is my passion and, as a boy, I even managed to turn my piano into an 'organ', thanks to Dad sawing up an old broom shank and Mum's typewriter, to make 'stops' to hang on either side! I took organ lessons from Dr Russell Missin, former Organist and Master of the Choristers of Newcastle Cathedral and became Organist at my home church of St. John the Baptist in Alnmouth and its sister church, St. Mary's, Lesbury. I was also Organist at St. Andrew's, Frimley Green, St. Lawrence, Mereworth and St. Dunstan, West Peckham and have been a Freelance Organist in churches and Duty Organist in crematoria for many years.

I obtained a first BA (Hons) in Music and Classical Studies with the Open University and was a teacher of Secondary Music for several years in schools in Camberley, Odiham, Alnwick and London, leading and directing several school choirs, before setting up my own online business: Musical Contexts, where I currently create online music education resources for primary and secondary classroom music teachers.

At Christ Church, we are fortunate in boasting an enthusiastic choir which sings at our weekly 10am Sung Communion and Family Services, and whom I very much enjoy working with. They lead our hymns and worship songs, sung service settings and sing a weekly anthem, meeting for half an hour before a service to rehearse, including singing at major festivals. If you enjoy singing and would like to be part of our friendly and passionate choir, we would love you to join us! The ability to read music is not essential since I will provide all the help and support you need. I appreciate that people have other commitments living in an area where there's so much on offer, but we would welcome new choir members even if you're only able to

join us for special occasions or the occasional Sunday – please do get in touch with me if you're interested.

There's lots of exciting things happening with music within our worship at Christ Church: on Mothering Sunday, I played a selection of Preludes written by female composers to celebrate 'Woman Composer Sunday', the choir have sang weekly anthems through Passiontide and Easter and two of our sopranos performed glorious solos.

Looking forward, I'm hosting an 'Organ Drop-In Day' on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> April between 10am and 2pm to celebrate the RCO International Organ Day – not a 'concert' but bring some requests or some music and have a go yourself and enter our 'guess how many organ pipes there are in the Christ Church organ?' competition (proceeds to the Electrical works for the church fund).

Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> June is **RSCM Music Sunday** where <u>YOU</u> get to choose the Preludes, Communion Interlude and Postlude played at the 10am Sunday service. *What are your favourite pieces of music that you'd like to hear played?* (Classical or Popular). Drop me an email, or come and chat over coffee after a service, with your suggestions and requests and **your** most popular pieces will be played to celebrate **Music Sunday** on 9<sup>th</sup> June.

I am indeed very happy to be sharing my musical gift with you all, to sing God's praises at Christ Church and in the community through music and song for many years to come.

### **Shamley Green History Society**



On Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> March, Tony Painter gave a talk on White Horses and Hill Figures.

Uffington White Horse – Berkshire – believed to be Bronze Age

Tony says: From the stylistic prehistoric beauty of Uffington, to the

disturbing virility of the Cerne Abbas giant, Hill Figures have always promoted awe, interest, fascination, excitement or even fear. Yet very little is known about them.

How old are they? Who made them, how and why? Hill figures, which mainly populate the chalk escarpments of southern England are not limited to horses; there are crosses, white marks, military badges and of course Long Men. And not all were white – the lost Red Horse of Tysoe near Warwick is an exception.

Disappointingly, most Hill Figures are recent – most appear to have been cut in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries. Some have long disappeared from the landscape through time and vegetation. Yet some do appear to have greater longevity. Recent soil analysis tends to place the Uffington horse at around 1300 – 500 BC. The current Westbury horse, probably the second best known,was cut in 1778. Military emblems such as those at Fovant and Bulford in Wiltshire are WW1 commemoratives. Some are still being cut as millennium memorials.



But the figure arousing most interest is the Cerne giant, whose appendage stands out from the Dorset hillside. He does not feature in monastic records of Cerne Abbey or detailed surveys from the 17<sup>th</sup> c. Illustrations of him were censored by the Victorians. Recent scientific investigations to determine the date at which the chalk was last exposed to sunlight, place the giant awkwardly as neither prehistoric, nor medieval, generating a fevered rethink by archaeologists,

Whatever his actual age, there is no doubt that he stands alone as a unique pointer to the past.

The next illustrated talk by Paul Whittle - "Steaming On", Best of UK's heritage railways, will be on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> May, at 2.30 pm in the Arbuthnot Hall, followed by tea and biscuits. Non-members will be welcome for a fee of £3.00.

### .The SGEG Wildflower Diary

Are you a nature lover? Do you go for walks around the village, maybe when family and friends are visiting? And do you wonder about the wildflowers you see? – there are lots around here, at least 180 species!

Well next time you're planning a local walk, why not have a look at the Shamley Green Environment Group Wildflower Diary – it's packed with photos of our local flora, with interesting information and ID tips for some of the lovely wildflowers you will certainly see when you're out and about. The Spring edition for 2024 was published in March, and there will shortly be another one on our website for early summer, but there are also diaries there for 2022 and 2023 as well so you can find out what you are likely to see at any time of the year.

The Wildflower Diary has grown out of the Environment Group monitoring our wildflowers to see how things go with the new reduced mowing regime in the village.

### To mow, or not to mow.....

In 2020 the Shamley Green Environment Group was asked to advise the parish council about how they could manage our common land in an environmentally friendly way, so we asked an expert in wild flower meadows, Prof James Hitchmough, for his advice.

He observed that we had a very depleted plant population on our greens, simply because of the long history of intensive mowing. Of course this will have knock-on effects for the whole ecosystem, starting with our insects on which so much else depends: insects everywhere are in a worrying decline, and many of us have witnessed this ourselves — once upon a time on a long motorway journey in the summer your windscreen would be absolutely splattered with flying insects, but that doesn't happen now does it - very worrying!

Farming practices have been a huge culprit in the decline, but farmers now are planting wildflower areas to try and redress the balance, thousands of miles of road verges are also being allowed to flower, and we can do our bit too by mowing our village greens less. So although some people will take a while to get used to a more natural look we have come up with a patchwork of mowing regimes depending on how the various greens are used. Areas like the cricket green, playground, and around the duck pond are mown regularly, as are the road verges in the village for

safety, but other areas are being cut only once a year to enable the plants there to produce flower and seed and to provide shelter for lots of small animals like mice. voles and amphibians. Importantly, by leaving the cut until October. animals like some grasshoppers are enabled to complete long and complicated cycles to reach life adulthood.
